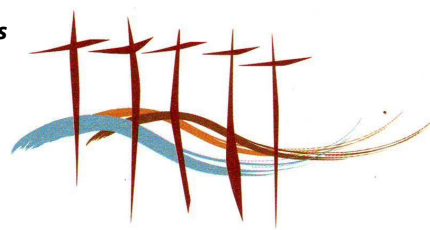

## Purity - the mark of a Christian

Dear brothers and sisters

In today's Gospel Jesus strongly criticises the attitude of the Scribes and Pharisees and teaches the need of “internal and external” purity. Here, Jesus turned the tables on a legalistic and “image conscious” society by inviting them to check “what is within” even as they present a seemingly clean external. Jesus exposed the paradox of their “clean periphery” and the “unclean centre”. Furthermore, Jesus inverts the measure of purity - purity as a virtue does not consist in the cleanliness of the externals such as the body, the clothing, food and the environment, rather in the purity of the inner chamber of the heart. Jesus is not negating the need for external purity, but is emphasizing the order of priority. Physical cleanliness follows the purity of heart. To be a Christian, then, is to be a clean person, pure in thoughts, intentions and dealings. “Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall have the vision of God” (Mt 5: 8). No wonder, Jesus has made it an imperative for His disciples to wash themselves in the waters of baptism and cleanse in the sanctifying grace of the Holy Spirit.

This purity is now made possible by three elements:

1) The Word of God, 2) The sacraments, and 3) Charity.

**The Word of God:** (The Source of Purity): The incarnate Word, Jesus Christ, is the norm and source of purity. He is the Holy One, who became man that mankind may be made holy. We have come to understand how to live in purity primarily by accepting the person of Jesus, in His teachings, examples and abiding presence. The Word of God sanctifies us from all impurities (1 Timothy 4:5).

**Sacraments:** (The visible signs of sanctifying grace); Rituals are part of any culture. Christian culture is rooted on sacramental rituals. The seven sacraments of the Church impart to the believer the grace necessary for his/her life. So, frequent reception of sacraments is necessary for a life of purity.

**Charity:** (Manifestation of sanctifying grace); Now, rituals, devoid of the spirit can remain just that - rituals. The sanctifying grace of the rituals are to be lived and practiced in the virtue of charity - selfless love. Love has the power to heal and cleanse. Any ritual without love is ineffective. Love teaches us that clean hands and clever minds are not substitutes for a clean conscience. A clean conscience is the manifestation of a loving heart. So, heart is the centre of purity.

Queensland Child Protection Week is held during the first full week of September each year. Schools, businesses, community groups and government organisations come together, to consider how best to promote the value of children and focus attention on issues of child abuse and neglect.

Children are a gift from God and must be protected from harm of every kind. Many Archdiocesan personnel through their ministries and services are in a unique position to identify child abuse and neglect and to do something about it.

The Archdiocese expects all personnel, including clergy, employees and volunteers to act upon concerns or complaints of abuse, and comply with reporting obligations.

Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility.

### Those who serve in the Archdiocese of Brisbane shall:

1. Commit to justice and equity by exhibiting the highest Christian ethical standards and personal integrity in their personal and professional conduct.
2. Uphold the dignity of all people and their right to respect by conducting themselves in a moral manner consistent with the discipline, norms and teachings of the Catholic Church.
3. Commit to safe and supportive relationships by not taking advantage of any pastoral or authoritative role for their own benefit; and by adhering to the requirements of the law of Queensland regarding reporting any suspected abuse of children, young people and vulnerable adults.
4. Respond with integrity to those who are poor, alienated or marginalised by not acting in an abusive or neglectful manner; and by sharing concerns about suspicious or inappropriate behaviour with the appropriate person in their organisational structure.
5. Strive for excellence in all their work by accepting their personal responsibility in the protection of children, young people and vulnerable adults from all forms of abuse and harm; by providing a professional work environment that is free from harassment; and following the policies and procedures of the Archdiocese of Brisbane.
6. Maintain appropriate professional boundaries in all contact settings including virtual by:
  - ~ demonstrating behaviour consistent with role and responsibilities;
  - ~ avoiding inappropriate emotional attachment;
  - ~ not forming or engaging in relationships of a personal or sexual nature;
  - ~ maintaining distance between work time and activities and personal time and activities;
  - ~ not accepting gifts or entering into financial relationships or transactions;
  - ~ not disclosing inappropriate personal information; and
  - ~ avoiding touch in a manner which is not a legitimate occupational requirement.

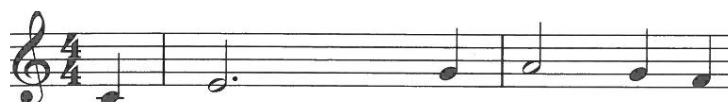
